About the Futures Program

Futures is a great way for athletes to continue to work on their skills during the off season. The Futures program consists of seven – 3-hour Training Sessions on either Saturday or Sunday during the months of January-April and every Futures athlete is invited to participate in their Regional Futures Tournament (RFT). The Northeast Region Regional Futures Tournament will be held May 12 (U16) and 13 (U14/U19) at UMass-Lowell.

Athletes who participated in the 2017 Futures Program last year do not need to register for a trial.
